



Since 2014, 6 modules of training and development have successfully been delivered on an annual basis by the AILG.

The AILG's "Elected Members Training Programme" delivers appropriate training across a wide range of local authority functions and related activities. Members who have attended the training modules will know that the training days are for the purpose of giving Elected Members the required knowledge of all local authority functions, from the best people available, to enable them to be effective Local Public Representatives.

Our training programme is delivered on a regional basis in conjunction with the Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government with speakers being made available from across various government departments, agencies and local authorities. However, we also try to include speakers from our own body of Elected Members who have the appropriate experience and expertise.



POLICY & RESEARCH DEVELOPMENT, LOBBYING & CAMPAIGN FOR IMPROVED TERMS & CONDITIONS FOR ELECTED MEMBERS

One of the main priorities of the AILG is to continuously develop policy on local government areas that are important to our Elected Members. The Association has had consultation inputs on a wide variety of areas including Coastal Planning, Flooding, Governance & Ethics, Housing, Planning, Emergency Planning, Brexit, Irish Water, Roads, and GDPR

Another important feature of this work is involved in scrutinising national legislation and government policy on local government including:

- I. Public Sector Standards Bill
- II. Planning & Development Amendment Act

- III. Local Government Rates Bill
- IV. Directly Elected Mayors
- V. Local Authority Leadership, Governance and Administration
- VI. National Planning Framework including ongoing engagement with Local Government Section DHPLG

As part of our policy work the AILG also appears before various Oireachtas committees in relation to areas such as Public Sector Standards Bill, Local Government Finance, LA Housing & Planning & Development Amendment Act.

FULL RECORD OF LOBBYING ACTIVITIES REGISTERED WITH LOBBYING REGULATOR INCLUDING;

- Seeking clarity regarding Programme for Government measures on local government reform
- Proposing amendment to the Planning and Development (Housing) Bill, 2016 so that Councillors would be consulted
- Pressing for reclassification of Councillors so as to open eligibility for social insurance benefits
- Proposing that offices of all public representatives be treated equally for valuation purposes

- Lobbying for improved support for local authority elected members
- Pressing Minister for Public Expenditure regarding improved channels of communication between Councillors and Government agencies
- Proposing provision for appropriately trained Fire Service personnel to respond to local medical/cardiac emergencies

POLICY DEVELOPMENT CAMPAIGN FOR IMPROVED TERMS & CONDITIONS FOR ELECTED MEMBERS

Improved remuneration for all Elected Members has been the number one priority for the AILG over the last number of years. Following the 2014 reforms it soon became very evident that all Elected Members were facing an increased workload in their role as elected members of their local authorities.

The AILG were successful in 2017 in gaining changes to the PRSI status for our members, which means that our members are now entitled to a number social welfare benefits on the payment of PRSI on their representational payment. We were also successful in securing the additional Municipal District/Area Allowance of €1,000 per annum, which was also introduced in 2017.

However, we are more than aware that these improvements go no where near far enough in order to provide an appropriate remuneration package for our members. To this end we were supportive of the establishment of the independent Moorhead review of both the role and remuneration of local authority members. The AILG submitted a detailed submission to this review in September 2018, which clearly set out a viable pathway going forward for an appropriate remuneration and support structure for our elected members in order for them to carry out their important role as members of their local authority.

Ms. Moorhead's final report is due to be delivered to Minister John Paul Phelan TD in the summer of 2019, with a firm commitment made by Minister Phelan that any recommendations for improvements to members remuneration that may be contained in the report, and if accepted and approved by government, will be backdated to 1st June 2019 which is the start date of this new council term.

A full summary of our actions and activities as part of our campaign for improved remuneration, terms and conditions for our Elected Members are as follows:

- July 2015 AILG National Survey on Workload of Elected Members
- Numerous delegations & lobbying days with Ministers, Opposition Party Leaders, Party Spoke-persons, TDs & Senators to lobby for improved terms & conditions for members
- Delegation to full meeting of FF Parliamentary Party on Members remuneration
- Introduction of new MD/Area Allowance of €1,000 gross per annum since 1st July 2017
- Successful in gaining a re-classification of PRSI Contribution payable on members representational payment from CLASS K to Class S ensuring some social welfare benefits now applicable to Elected Members
- Lobbied for the set up of an independent review of Councillors Remuneration, Terms & Conditions
- Independent review on the Role & Remuneration of Local Authority Elected Members by Ms. Sara Moorhead SC, commenced in June 2018.
- AILG's comprehensive submission to this review on the Role
 Remuneration of Elected Members published in September 2018.
- Moorhead Interim Report published in December 2018
- Final Report due to be published by Summer 2019.

CONGRESS OF LOCAL & REGIONAL AUTHORITIES IN EUROPE (C.L.R.A.E)



The AILG Office provides the Secretariat to the Irish local government delegation to the Council of Europe in Strasbourg. Four Irish Councillors nominated for a four-year term attend the bi-annual meetings of the Congress of Local & Regional Authorities in Europe (CLRAE) which is the local government tier of the Council of Europe. There they meet in the Chamber of Local Authorities with representatives from all 47 member states of the Council of Europe. They discuss issues and concerns relating to local democracy and the protection of democracy itself. There is an emphasis on issues to do with the participation of minority groups including migrants in all facets of local democracy.

The reference document is the European Charter of Local Self-Government which has been formally signed and ratified by Ireland. The Irish delegates also take part in meetings of the three major committees of the Congress: Monitoring, Governance and Current Affairs. In addition the Irish delegates have been sought after to participate in democracy development projects especially for women in local government in the emerging democracies of the Balkan States.

The Irish Delegation for the period 2016-2020 comprises of: Cllrs Pat McGowan (Head of Delegation), Rosaleen O'Grady (Deputy Head), Mary Hanna Hourigan and John Crowe. The Secretary to the Delegation is Liam Kenny, Director AlLG.
