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Role of LAs in local and community development

Vision for Local Government

Local government will be the main vehicle of governance and public service at local level - leading economic, social and community development, delivering efficient and good value services, and representing citizens and local communities effectively and accountably

- Long history of involvement in community initiatives and service provision, i.e. libraries, leisure, recreation, arts etc.
- Strategic leadership role in *Putting People First*
- Stronger focus on local and community development
- Alignment of community sector with LA structures

Why were LCDCs established

- Address governance deficit
- Local Authorities to have a more central role in oversight, coordination and planning of local and community development programmes
- A more joined-up approach to service delivery at local level
- Greater efficiency and effectiveness in publicly funded programmes
- Identify priorities and solutions, match resources to priorities and make best use of local resources
- Better services for citizens and communities

What is a Local Community Development Committee (LCDC)

- Committee of the Local Authority
- Independent in performance of its functions and decision making
- Specific, independent exercisable powers and functions Section 128A of Local Government Reform Act 2014
- Membership typically 17-19, drawn from public and private sectors
- Balance of membership weighted in favour of the private sector
- 3-4 elected members on all LCDCs






Typical LCDC Membership (based on 19 members)

<u>Public Members</u>	(max 9)	Private Members (min 10)
LA Elected Members	3-4	Local & Community Development 1-3 Bodies
Local Authority Officials	2	Community & Voluntary (nominated through PPN) 5
Public authorities (typically HSE, DSP,ETB)	3-4	Other local interests 2-4 (Business, Farming etc.)

Chairperson elected by the Committee (33 LCDCs, 15 chaired by Elected Members)

Purpose and Functions of LCDCs (1)

- Bring all actors together to ensure a **stronger** and **more strategic** focus on local and community development
- Build a true partnership approach at local level, comprising local authorities, State and non-State local development agencies, community and voluntary organisations and other representatives of civil society
- Manage and oversee implementation of local and community development programmes (own and others')
- Provide for meaningful citizen engagement in planning, delivery and evaluation of programmes




Purpose and Functions of LCDCs (2)

- Co-ordination, planning and oversight of local development spend
- Match resources to priorities
- More joined-up approach to implementation of programmes at local level
- Pursue more cost efficient administration of programmes, and VFM in management and delivery of programmes
- Pursue opportunities for additional funding for the area



Current Work Programme

- Developing the community elements of the Local Economic and Community Plans (LECP)
 - Working closely with local statutory structures, communities and committees to identify local priorities.
- Managing delivery of SICAP
- LEADER programme 2014-2020 seeking to be LAG
- Developing capacity of members for full breadth of functions
- Identify other sources of funding





Role of Elected Members on LCDCs

- Governance, monitoring, oversight responsibilities
 - LCDC and LA delivery
 - State agencies and others delivering services locally
- Represent the views of the full council
- Represent the needs of communities in relation to local and community development needs
- Elected members critical to targeting of resources and delivery of services
- Bring a strategic view and oversight of local and community development needs





Supports (1)

Chief Officer

 Supports and assists the LCDC and works with the Chairperson to provide guidance and strategic direction to the LCDC

PPN

- Conduit for ongoing dialogue with local communities
- Facilitates input by communities into decision making on local and community development funding



Supports (2)

Public Sector Agencies

- Cross-government support to local and community development
- Facilitate interagency working and collaboration
- Protocol for engagement with broad range of other structures and committees e.g. CYPSCs, Traveller Interagency Groups, Drugs and Alcohol Task Forces

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• Technical advice and support, e.g. programme delivery and management matters
