Affordable Housing Act 2021 Legislative basis



Key Features

- Local Authority Affordable Purchase Scheme
- First Home Shared Equity Scheme
- Established Cost Rental Tenure
- Changes to Part V

Changes to Part V

- 2021 Act restored the 20% provision under Part V
- At least 10% for Social and up to 10% for Affordable or Cost Rental Housing

Housing for All Plan Policy basis






Housing for All set out 4 pathways to a Sustainable Housing System

- Pathway 1: Increasing Affordability/Home ownership (First Home, Cost Rental, STAR, AHF, LDA Project Tosaigh)
- Pathway 2: Eradicating Homelessness/Social Housing Delivery
- Pathway 3: Increasing new Housing supply via mechanisms such as Land Value Sharing (LVS), Urban Development Zones (UDZ) and Croí Cónaithe (Cities) Scheme
- **Pathway 4:** Vacancy and Existing Stock (Towns Centre First/Croí Cónaithe Towns)

- Local Authority as housing authority with strategic oversight of affordable housing programme in LA area
 - LA arranged delivery/New housing activity & First Home or Part V / AHB projects / LDA delivery
 - Affordable tenure mix affordable purchase v cost rental

Affordable Housing Delivery to date



- Over 12,800 affordable housing supports delivered including
 - √ 1,600 LA Affordable Purchase homes;
 - √ 3,700 Cost Rental homes via AHBs, LAs & LDA;
- 2024 over 7,000 affordable housing options delivered;
- More than 5,000 LA affordable homes approved for support (affordable purchase and cost rental) across 22 local authorities;
- Over 6,000 FHS approvals have been issued 74% of all approvals issued in Dublin, Cork, Kildare, Meath, and Wicklow;
- Over 10,000 VPRG applications received by local authorities; 6,700 applications approved; nearly 900 grants paid.

Affordable Purchase – visible progress



Opportunities for affordable purchase homes have been advertised in 22 LAs to date

Carlow, Clare, Cork City & County, all 4 Dublin LAs, Galway City, Galway County, Kildare, Kilkenny, Laois, Limerick, Louth, Mayo, Meath, Monaghan, Waterford, Westmeath, Wexford and Wicklow

- Prices vary, but the following examples illustrate the lower and upper minimum price range for some affordable homes offered to date
 - Dún an Rí, Coosan, Athlone, Co. Westmeath 2 Bed
 Semi-D €245,000, 3 Bed Semi-D €300,000;
 - Elder Walk, Summerfields, Kilbarry, Co Waterford 3 Bed €226,564, 4 Bed €256,214;
 - Kilmartin Grove Hollystown, Fingal 2 bed mid tce €310,000 and 3 Bed Mid Tce €340,000.












Number of Affordable Purchase and Cost Rental by LA, 2022 - 2024
